MARCH 23 AT LANDMARK'S LUMIERE THEATRE**

**Intense, Poetic Drama of Man Documenting his Plan of Murder
Features Local Cast, Noir Style and Stunning Music by Michael Slattery and SHOULDERS**

San Francisco, CA – *Centaur* (USA 2011), JP Allen's surprising and poetic story about a San Francisco man documenting his plan of murder and revenge makes its Theatrical Premiere on **March 23** at **Landmark's Lumiere Theatre (1572 California Street, SF, CA)**.

In Allen's haunting and unexpectedly sensual drama, an unidentified man is stunned by the death of his girlfriend, Jennifer, in a car accident with a drunk driver. However, the drunk escapes punishment because of a mistake by the police. Determined to get revenge, the unidentified man decides to play a "complex game" of murder and record his efforts, and memories of Jennifer, by making a video that mirrors a gift she gave him just before she died. Filmed in spectacular locations in and around San Francisco and the Golden Gate Bridge, in a noir style, this local independent drama features outstanding performances by Bay Area actors JP Allen, as the unidentified main character, Amy Mordecai as Jennifer, and Chris Pflueger as the driver. *Centaur* also showcases brilliant music by popular Austin band, Michael Slattery and SHOULDERS.
